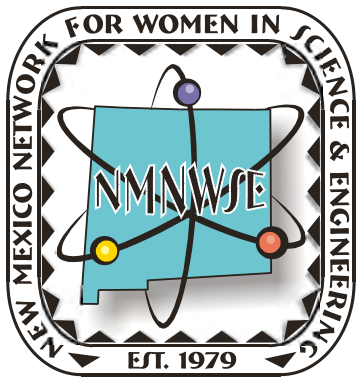

### ***Culture Contact: The Archaeology of the Salinas Missions National Monument***

Prof. Troy Lovata, Honors College, University of New Mexico

The Salinas Missions National Monument, made up of the sites of Abo, Quarai, and Gran Quivira, is one of the most visible reminders of the important role that the lands on the eastern flanks of the Manzano Mountains played in Colonial New Mexico. Contact era interactions between Native American groups and Spanish settlers left indelible marks on the landscape. But the archaeology of the region goes back much further and set the stage for how New Mexico would develop for the next three and a half centuries following the construction of the missions. This talk will discuss human organization and more than a half century of archaeological research in the region.
